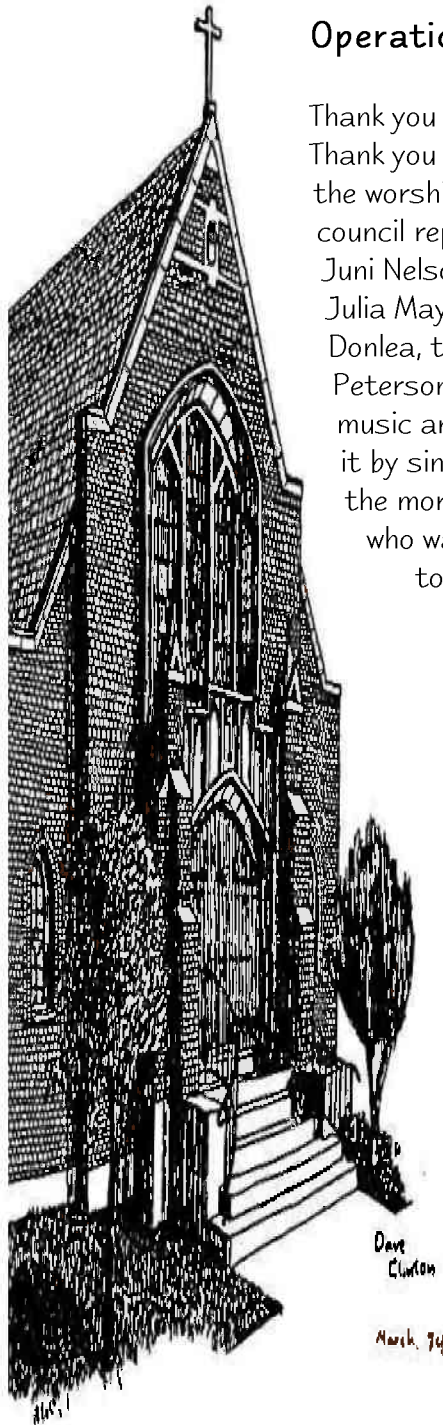

## *News from Church Council*

Dear Centralites,

We continue to be amazed at the amount of activity we have here at Central...there are lots of great ideas and great energy!

We began our May council meeting with a Pastor's report. We continue to appreciate Pastor Cindy's leadership style, sense of humor, and experience. She provides us with a new and valuable perspective as we do our best to lead the congregation. Specifically, much of her first three months have been consumed by facilities issues... our furnace and sewer have had major emergency repairs...and she managed the process of getting both repaired seamlessly. She is working with the "new hire task force" (focused on hiring an additional ministry staff position yet this year), developing a new confirmation program, and all of the other committees and activities at Central.

At the May meeting we also spent time discussing final details for the Installation service. Special thanks from the council to Nancy Fall, John Mostrom, and Barbara Palecek for their roles in making the service and reception a success.

We then spent a majority of the meeting continuing (from council retreat) our discussion and prioritizing goals for our four main areas of activity at Central: People, Programs, Property, and Partners. Council will regroup on these draft goals for the 2011-12 program year and determine final priorities at its June meeting.

As mentioned above, the council had to address the expenditure of \$5,000 (the maximum the council may approve without congregational approval) to replace our sewer line. Council is determined to work with Duane and Pastor Cindy to document all the neglected maintenance issues and get the congregation onto a regular maintenance program. The reality is that we have two old buildings and heavy usage on lunch days. There have been constant facility issues to deal with in Pastor Cindy's short tenure. We hope this will not always be the case!

We briefly discussed a request for financial support from the Columbia City Hope Mission Lutheran church and deferred any decision until the council reconvened.

We have been very busy in the past few months, with Thursday suppers now offered every week at All Pilgrims Church and the number of guests growing every week. Stop by and eat with us Thursdays at 5pm—it is a very pleasant place to have supper. We even served donated New York strip steaks at two recent meals, and they were very well received! And a special thanks to David Anstine for joining the Community Lunch Board of Directors. He is a great addition to our board.

**MORE VOLUNTEERS ARE NEEDED ON FRIDAYS AT CENTRAL LUTHERAN!** If you have time on Fridays please come help. We start at 9 and are done by 1:30. Any part of this time you are available would be greatly appreciated. We have free parking behind the church off East Olive. Everyone is welcome and you need no experience.

At Central Lutheran we continue to serve a large number of guests, averaging 245 per meal. We have a dedicated group of cooks who are very generous with their time, along with dining room volunteers who direct an ever growing number of student groups. This month we have two groups visiting from North Dakota and another group from Michigan! We also just began a collaboration with the University of Washington, and their volunteers join others from Seattle University, Seattle Central CC, St. Francis and St. Joseph schools. These groups are helping out at both All Pilgrims and at Central Lutheran.

We resumed picking up fantastic produce at the Capitol Hill Farmers Market for the summer in May. We receive amazing organic produce that makes our salads and vegetarian dishes spectacular at all three meals each week. Thanks to Brian Schoof for volunteering his time for all our weekend donation pickups. We also receive great produce from the South Lake Union Residence Inn, so please thank them and all of our donors when you have the opportunity.

Thank you to everyone who supported our 2011 Spring Fundraiser. It was the most successful ever, thanks in large part to the sponsorship of Swedish Hospital. We raised over \$17,000 through the generosity of so many companies and individuals. A heads up: we have already scheduled our **Volunteer Recognition Dinner** for Sunday, November 6th at 5pm at All Pilgrims Church. Save the date now for this free and fun event!

We received a \$2,000 grant from the City of Seattle PeoplePoint program to participate in their new computerized benefits system. Essentially staff and volunteers will attend training sessions this June to learn how the system works so we can help guests at the meals maximize their benefits, including food stamps, General Assistance, and rent/utility assistance. The money from this grant will most likely be used to purchase a laptop so those with the training can help guests during each of the three meals. We are very excited about expanding our ability to help those most in need in our community.



## *News from Seattle's Progressive Preschool*

### **Building the foundations of social justice at Seattle's Progressive Preschool**

A strong pillar of our mission at SPP is social justice. What this looks like in the classroom is not only evident in the books we display and read, or the service projects we take part in, but more tellingly it's in our everyday conversations, interactions, and activities with our preschoolers. There are hundreds of teachable moments each day as the children explore and experience right and wrong, feelings of injustice or unfairness, and what is kind or unkind.

Several weeks ago the children helped in constructing a puppet theater with the simplest of materials: a cardboard box, crayons, and tape. There are small windows for the puppets to peek through and act out story after story. As part of our social justice curriculum, Teacher Sarah decided to put on a puppet show during circle time. These puppets, one black and one white, asked the kids to help them decide if their actions were kind or unkind. She displayed pushing, taking things from one another, name calling, and then hugging, sharing and working together on each other's

ideas. The children were not only focused and answered appropriately and seriously, but they took on the role of puppeteer and began asking their audience, "Tell me if this is kind or unkind." The same answers came. The next week the same scenarios were displayed by Teacher Sarah, but this time the children were asked if they could help solve the problem. "The lamb is feeling left out, what can you do?" They answered with empathy and care, offering hugs, asking if she is ok, offering to spend time with her.



Week after week these puppets are used to role play social justice issues. If one puppet is hungry, the other puppets find food. If one is homeless, they invite him in to their shelter. This is a very fun way for the children to learn about very serious issues in their communities and world. The puppets even help us at clean-up time, and gratitude is offered and received, from one puppet to another!

## Faith and Everyday Life

### Eccl 3:4 A Time to Laugh

There is a saying that goes, "Life is grim, but not necessarily serious."

What if laughing was a key to flexibility? When Norman Cousins wrote his book, Anatomy of an Illness, he was literally laughing himself out of heart disease. His approach consisted of mega doses of vitamin C, training himself to laugh and watching Marx Brothers' movies. Although most of us can't get that same dramatic result, we may be able to laugh ourselves into flexibility.

Maybe we could do a belly laugh or find humor in situations that don't initially seem to be funny. After all, the times that call for laughing greatly overshadow the times that call for weeping.

Could it be possible that the person who laughs first sees more options than the person who scowls first? Scowling and frowning are physically and emotionally constricting activities. They narrow us and pull us into a vigilant protective mode. They make us *less* aware rather than more aware. Instead of becoming lighter on our feet, we become planted and rooted.

No longer flexible like the palm tree, we snap like a dried branch and die, emotionally, if not physically. God is not a constricted God and did not create us for such a living death.

There is not only a time to laugh but it is essential that we do. Laughing keeps us alive and present to the changing world around us. Laughing keeps us flexible.

Maybe God is laughing too. Maybe we should just laugh together. *Lutheran Counseling Network*

## Candlelight Concert Benefits Immanuel Community Services' Programs

On Friday evening, June 3, 2011 at 7:30 PM, Immanuel Community Services will host a benefit concert in the century-old Immanuel Lutheran Church. The beauty of this 100 year old church, located at 1215 Thomas Street in the Cascade Neighborhood, provides the perfect setting for the magical music performed by World Flute Master Gary Stroutsos and Percussionist David Revelli.



Gary Stroutsos' music is influenced by many musical traditions, but he is perhaps best known for his work with American Indian cultures. He is featured in Ken Burns PBS documentary, "Lewis and Clark." His influences include jazz, Afro-Cuban and Far Eastern musical traditions. Playing with Gary will be David Revelli, who gained a reputation as a popular drummer for Mary Chapin Carpenter, Jewel and Sheryl Crow. David's interest in Middle Eastern drumming lends beautifully with Stroutsos' mystical flute work.

All proceeds from this evening concert support Immanuel Community Services, a non-profit organization providing hope, dignity and community to people who are hungry, homeless or struggling with addiction. Their services include a Food Bank, a monthly Community Meal, a Recovery Center for men, and a Hygiene Program for men and women who are homeless and need a place to shower and launder their clothes. 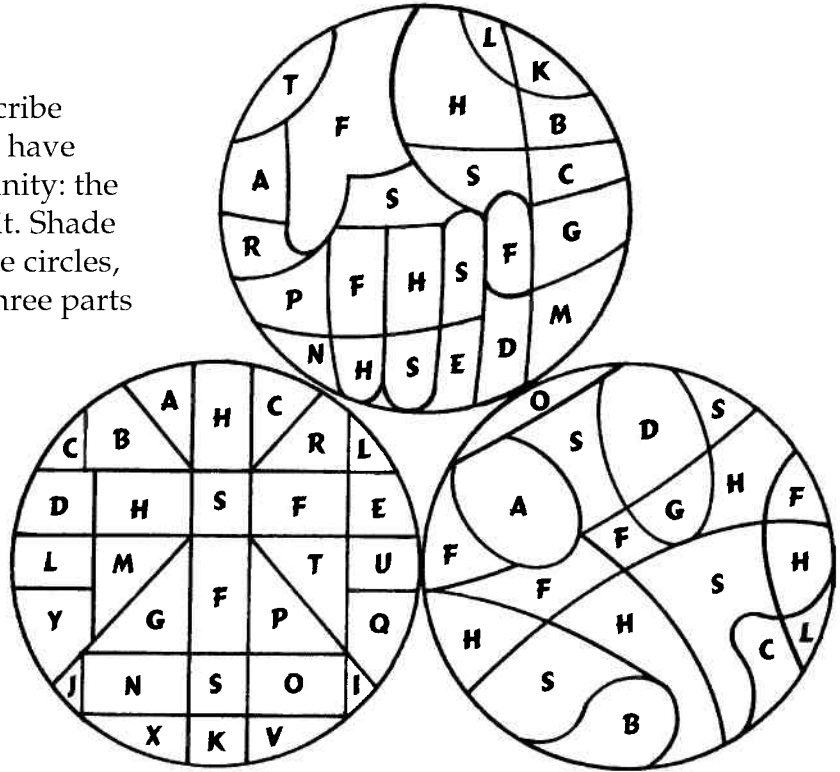

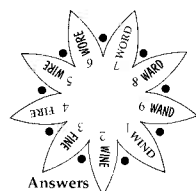
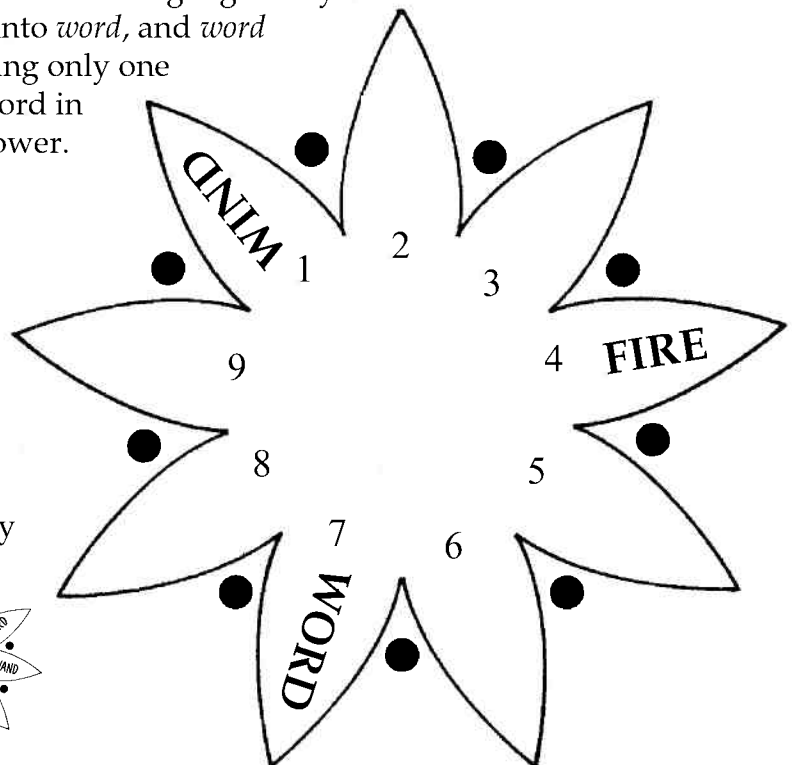


### Three Little Words
